

Training Packages

General Speech, Language and Communication Training

Language Stimulation Groups and Secondary Transition Groups

We can also work alongside school staff training them to feel confident to run <u>Language</u> <u>Stimulation Groups</u> (across Nursery, Reception and KS1, KS2 and KS3) and <u>Secondary Transitions Groups</u>.

<u>Language Stimulation Groups</u> can provide help to children and young people who require additional support to develop their language skills. The groups support students to develop their:

- Attention/listening skills
- Group skills
- Vocabulary knowledge (e.g. core vocabulary, basic concepts, categorisation, similarities/differences)
- Ability to follow instructions of increasing complexity
- Understanding of different concepts (e.g. adjectives, before/after, first/next/last)
- Ability to answer questions
- Sequencing and narrative skills
- Reasoning skills (including inference/prediction)
- Ability to give a news account and ask questions about peer's news
- Knowledge of simple strategies (e.g. asking for repetition, asking for word meaning, dictionary skills, using word webs)

<u>Secondary Transition Groups</u> provide support to students as they prepare to transition from Primary school to Secondary school. The groups cover topics such as:

- Getting to know new people
- The differences between primary & secondary school.
- Reading & using a timetable and homework diary
- Organisation skills
- Active listening skills and clarification strategies
- Secondary school problem solving
- Reading a school map and finding your way around

- Making and keeping friends.
- Giving compliments and joining in a conversation
- Bullying
- Self-help strategies (e.g. identifying key words, asking for help, using a dictionary, and using a word map)

Some of the Language Stimulation Groups formed part of a research project that demonstrated statistically significant and sustained change for students who took part in the interventions. The research project also demonstrated that the staff trained by a SLT to deliver Secondary Transition Groups were as effective as the SLT run groups during the project.
